What is Homeless Services Integration?

HSI, The Homeless Services Integration Initiative, is streamlined approach service provision for families facing housing instability. Families experiencing housing instability may now go to the Williams Virginia Family Resource Center (VWFRC) to apply for public benefits (TANF, Food Stamps, and Medicaid), complete the required TANF Orientation, Assessment and Individual Responsibility Plan process, receive preventative and emergency services, and work collaboratively with an Integrated Service Team to coordinate their needs to move towards self-sufficiency.

What Services are Offered at VWFRC?

Families seeking emergency assistance around their housing instability are screened to determine the severity of their needs.

VWFRC is not a shelter. Families participate in a Unified Screening process for all services and benefits. Eligible families may receive services such as prevention resources, including emergency rental and utility assistance. or temporary emergency shelter. Other services include referrals for employment training, work readiness, and job placement assistance.

Who is Considered Homeless?

Families currently facing housing instability must complete the DHS Housing Instability Assessment determine their needs and appropriate resources. The Integrated Service Teams at VWFRC have been trained to respond to families' needs based on the results of this assessment. The **VWFRC** Integrated Service Team will work with the family to support them in moving to safe, stable, and appropriate housing as quickly as possible.

Where Do I Go If I'm In Need of Homeless Services?

The Virginia Williams Family Resource Center (VWFRC) serves as the central point of intake for families experiencing housing instability in the District of Columbia. VWFRC is located at 920 Rhode Island Avenue, NE, Washington, DC.

When Can I Go to VWFRC?

The VWFRC is open Monday-Thursday from 8:30 am until 4:00 p.m. The telephone number is (202) 526-0017.
