



IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND FACTS ABOUT SNAP EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAM (SNAP E&T)

The **MISSION** of the SNAP Employment and Training Program (SNAP E&T) formally known as FSET, is to assist **SNAP** recipients in gaining employment or skills that would increase self-sufficiency.

WHAT IS THE NEWLY REVISED SNAP E&T PROGRAM?

The **SNAP E&T** has transitioned to an “All Voluntary Program.” Although participation in the **SNAP E&T** program is now voluntary, **SNAP** customers must meet work registration requirements.

WHAT SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE?

- Transportation Costs
 - Educational Services
 - Job Placement Services
 - Use of the Computer Lab
 - Interviewing Techniques
 - Childcare Costs
 - On the Job Training
 - Case Management
 - Resume Development
- And other support services

HOW DO YOU APPLY?

Once you receive a referral from your **SSR** (Caseworker), an invitation for orientation, with appointment date and time, will be sent out based on random selection. Walk-ins are accepted.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM?

All potential participants must register for work. Customers who meet one of the federal exemptions listed below are not required to register for work. Anyone can participate in the voluntary **SNAP E&T** program.

The exemptions are:

- Under age 16 or over the age of 59
- Physically or mentally challenged, disabled or incapacitated
- Subject to and in compliance with work requirements for other programs, i.e., TANF
- Caretaker for dependents under age 6 or an incapacitated individual
- Receiving unemployment insurance compensation
- Participating in a drug or alcohol treatment and rehabilitation program
- Employed 30 hours per week
- A student enrolled at least half time

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WHAT DO YOU NEED TO BRING?

- Photo ID
- Invitation Letter
- Resume

- Waivers or assistance with certain training and employment related fees
