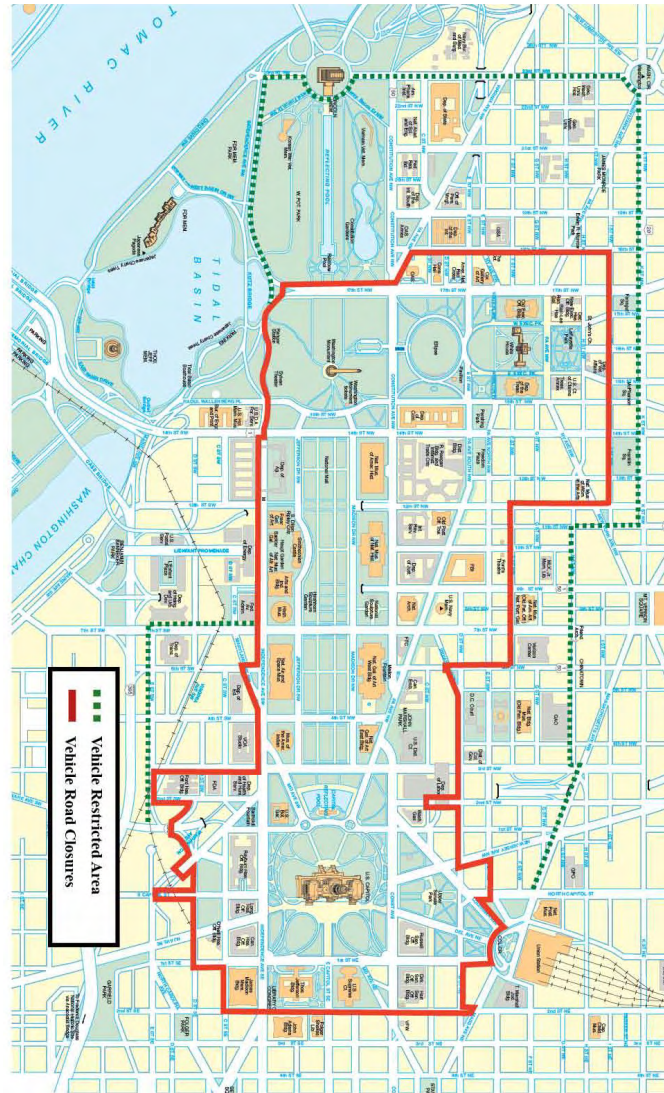

Overnight Shelters

Shelter Availability

All District contracted low-barrier shelters for individuals will remain open from 7 p.m. on Saturday, Jan. 19 through 7 a.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 22. Additional meals will be available at the shelters during this period. These shelters will have televisions tuned in to Inaugural activities, for those who want to watch the events. This applies to the following District-contracted sites:

Access to the Downtown

Street Closures and Restricted Areas

A number of streets will be closed or subject to restricted entry before and on the day of the Inauguration, Monday, Jan. 21. The areas that will be closed to entry include places where people are currently sleeping and storing personal belongings.

A map of these areas, as identified by the U.S. Secret Service as of Jan. 11, is on the back of this flier. Additional information on the boundaries of the secured areas may be available closer to the day of the Inauguration.

The District Government’s Department of Human Services and Department of Mental Health, along with social service providers, will be working to reach out to all persons who might be affected when these areas are temporarily restricted. This effort will include connecting any person who will be temporarily displaced with an available 24-hour shelter, as well as arranging for temporary storage of personal items.

Access to the Parade Route

Anyone who wishes to view the parade or other official Inauguration-related events in person will be required to enter the Mall area at designated sites, and is subject to search. Prohibited items include backpacks, bags larger than 8 by 6 by 4 inches, bicycles and glass containers.

Mobile Meal Programs

McKenna’s Wagon will not be serving food at its van stops on Sunday, Jan. 20 or Monday, Jan. 21 and instead will be serving food from the Martha’s Table front door on both days at 2114 14th St., NW from 5:00—6:00 p.m.

The Salvation Army Grate Patrol will be operating Sunday, Jan. 20 and Monday, Jan. 21 but stops may change based on street closures.

Transportation

Transportation To and From Shelters

Due to street closures, transportation from the shelters will be suspended beginning on the morning of Sunday, Jan. 20, to resume on the morning of Tuesday, Jan. 22. There will be no transportation to the shelters from downtown on the evenings of Sunday, Jan. 20 or Monday, Jan. 21. Shelter transportation will return to the regular schedule on the morning of Tuesday, Jan. 22.

The UPO Hotline vans will operate on a regular schedule on Monday, Jan. 21, but because of anticipated traffic congestion and street closures, it may be impossible for the vans to reach all locations, particularly those within the restricted areas. The Hotline may be reached at 1-800-535-7252 or by calling 311.

Public Transportation

On Monday Jan. 21, Metrorail will open at 4 a.m. and close at 2 a.m. The Smithsonian, Mount Vernon, and Archives metrorail stations will be closed. Metrorail will provide 17 consecutive hours of rush-hour service -- from 4 a.m. until 9 p.m. Peak fares will be in effect during that time.

On Monday Jan.21, Metrobus will operate weekday rush hour service in the morning, followed by an early rush hour in the afternoon. Many routes will operate on detours due to Inaugural events.

Other Information

The **Health Care for the Homeless** vans will not be operating on Monday, Jan. 21.

The **Travelers Aid** location at Union Station will be operating Monday, Jan. 21 on their regular 9:30 a.m.—5:30 p.m. schedule.
