SNAP E&T SERVICE PROVIDERS – FY2026

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Employment and Training (SNAP E&T) Program assists SNAP recipients in achieving their career goals by providing participants with a broad range of services focused on their interests and needs. The District's SNAP E&T program is voluntary, and participants receive reimbursements for eligible transportation, childcare, and other expenses related to participation. The District acts as the prime grantee for the federal SNAP Employment and Training grant allocated each year by the United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service (USDA-FNS) to each State Agency. Pass-through funding is distributed to third-party providers by the District to operationalize the program for participants as sub-grantees. **Table One: SNAP E&T Provider List** provides details about the educational, vocational, and work-experience services offered by each of the FY 2026 DC SNAP Employment and Training Providers.
